4 5 6 7	AN ORDINANCE introduced by Council Member Brendan Jensen, creating Chapter 10.80 in Title 10 of the Topeka Municipal Code concerning Pedestrian and Traffic Safety.				
8 9	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF TOPEKA, KANSAS:				
10	Section 1. That The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended				
11	by adding a section, to be numbered 10.80.010, which said section reads as follows:				
12	<u>Findings.</u>				
13	The governing body makes the following findings:				
14	(a) The high volume of motor vehicles travelling on congested roadways in				
15	the city makes mixing pedestrian and the moving, slowing or temporarily stopping of				
16	motor vehicles in the same space, at the same time, inherently dangerous.				
17	(b) Pedestrians distracting drivers from the task of driving by approaching a				
18	stopped vehicle, attracting and/or attempting to attract the attention of the driver of a				
19	motor vehicle for the purpose of inducing that driver to slow or stop the vehicle to				
20	facilitate the transfer of anything by the pedestrian to the driver or passenger is				
21	hazardous to public safety, both for occupants of motor vehicles and for pedestrians.				
22	(c) The prohibitions set forth in this chapter are narrowly tailored to serve the				
23	significant interest of promoting and protecting the public health, safety and welfare and				
24	that these prohibitions leave open ample alternative channels of communication				
25	throughout the city.				
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28	(d) It is the intent of this chapter to protect the health, safety and general
29	welfare of the citizens of the city, to assure the free, orderly, undisrupted movement of
30	motor vehicles at designated intersections within city limits, and to provide for the safety
31	and interests of pedestrians and of occupants of motor vehicles located at designated
32	intersections within the city and to reduce the number of pedestrian and motor vehicles
33	accidents occurring within the city.
34	(e) Pedestrians are increasingly using highways and roadways in ways for
35	which the roads were not designed or intended. These uses include approaching
36	vehicles when stopped or in use or staying upon medians and in the public right of way
37	for purposes other than crossing the highway. These activities create safety hazards for
38	pedestrians and distract drivers, making automobile accidents more likely. This chapter
39	is designed to decrease the safety hazards by restricting such activity. These safety
40	concerns are most acute in the busiest intersections in the city.
41	Section 2. That The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended
42	by adding a section, to be numbered 10.80.020, which said section reads as follows:
43	Designated Intersections.
44	Due to the high number of reported crashes and the prevalence of distracted
45	driving as a contributing factor in these crashes, the following intersections are hereby
46	designated as having restricted pedestrian activity as specified in section 10.80.030:
47	S 5th Street and SW Topeka Boulevard
48	SW 12 <sup>th</sup> Street and SW Jackson Street
49	SW 6 <sup>th</sup> Avenue and Orchard Street
50	SW 8 <sup>th</sup> Avenue and SW Topeka Boulevard

51	SW 10 <sup>th</sup> Avenue and SW Topeka Boulevard
52	SW Huntoon Street and SW Gage Boulevard
53	SW 21st Street and SW Fairlawn Road
54	SW 6 <sup>th</sup> Avenue and SW Topeka Boulevard
55	SW 10 <sup>th</sup> Avenue and SW Lane Street
56	SE 21st Street and SE Adams Street
57	SW 29th Street and SW Fairlawn Road
58	SW 21st Street and SW Gage Boulevard

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73	Section 3. That The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended

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by adding a sectio	n, to be number	red 10.80.030	), which said	section reads a	s follows:

## <u>Prohibition: Pedestrians Entering or Staying Upon Roadways at Certain</u> <u>Intersections.</u>

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to go upon any roadway or remain alongside any roadway at any of the intersections designated in Section 10.80.020 and approach a vehicle stopped on the roadway or attempt to attract the attention of the driver or occupant of a motor vehicle for the purpose of inducing the driver of the motor vehicle to remain stopped, slow or stop the vehicle to facilitate a transfer of anything from the driver or occupant of the vehicle to the pedestrian or the transfer of anything by the pedestrian to the driver or occupant.
- (b) No person shall be upon the median of a roadway at any of the intersections designated in Section 10.80.020 unless that person is in the process of crossing the roadway.
- (c) No person shall activate a pedestrian crosswalk signal for any purpose other than to stop traffic to allow such person to cross the roadway.
- (d) It is prima facie evidence of a violation of subsection (b) and (c) if the person stays on the median or at the intersection through two consecutive opportunities to legally cross the roadway. This may include a change in the traffic control signal or lack of traffic. After two such consecutive opportunities, such person shall not be considered to be using the crosswalk for purposes of the exception in subsection (f)(1).
- (e) No driver or operator of a motor vehicle shall park, stop, or leave standing a vehicle on a roadway at any of the intersections designated in Section 10.80.020 or suddenly decrease the speed of such vehicle or deviate from a traffic lane for the

97	purpose of responding to persons violating subsection (a), (b), or (c).
98	(f) Exceptions. This chapter does not apply to:
99	(1) Persons using a crosswalk to cross the roadway.
100	(2) Persons engaged in law enforcement, emergency, or rescue
101	activities, including providing assistance to an injured or disabled vehicle or
102	person.
103	(3) Persons engaged in repair or maintenance activities of highways
104	under the direction of the city or state.
105	(4) Streets or portions thereof that have been closed pursuant to
106	authorization from the City, including but not limited to special events permitted
107	pursuant to Chapter 12.70.
108	Section 4. That The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended
109	by adding a section, to be numbered 10.80.040, which said section reads as follows:
110	Penalty.
111	Any person who violates the provisions of TMC 10.80.030 is guilty of a
112	misdemeanor. Upon conviction, a person shall be sentenced to a fine not to exceed
113	four hundred and ninety-nine dollars (\$499) and/or imprisonment not to exceed thirty
114	(30) days.
115	Section 5. That The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended
116	by adding a section, to be numbered 10.80.050, which said section reads as follows:
117	Severability.
118	If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or other provision of this ordinance
119	is held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision

120	shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.
121	Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its
122	passage, approval and publication in the official City newspaper.
123	Section 7. This ordinance shall supersede all ordinances, resolutions or rules,
124	or portions thereof, which are in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance.
125	Section 8. Should any section, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared
126	invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the validity of this
127	ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.
