1 (Published in the Topeka Metro News December 14, 2020) 2 3 **ORDINANCE NO. 20273** 4 5 AN ORDINANCE introduced by City Manager Brent Trout granting the petition for a 6 Community Improvement District (CID) for the Downtown Ramada 7 Hotel & Convention Center; establishing the CID; and levying a CID 8 sales tax of two percent (2%) within the CID 9 WHEREAS, pursuant to the Community Improvement District Act, K.S.A. 12-10 11 6a26 through 12-6a36, as amended (the "Act") cities are authorized to establish Community Improvement Districts ("CID") for economic development purposes; and 12 13 WHEREAS, on November 3, 2020, the City received a petition from the owner of 14 record of One Hundred Percent (100%) of the land within the proposed CID generally described as the Downtown Ramada Hotel & Convention Center; and 15 WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 9199 adopted on November 10, 2020 the 16 17 City has provided notice that it would hold a public hearing on December 1, 2020 to consider establishing a CID and make findings necessary therefore; and 18 WHEREAS, the Governing Body conducted and concluded a public hearing on 19 20 December 1, 2020; and 21 WHEREAS, the Act provides that upon the conclusion of the public hearing the 22 Governing Body may grant the petition and authorize the CID and project therein. 23 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF TOPEKA, 24 KANSAS, that: 25 Section 1. Nature of the Project. The general nature of the CID Project 26 involves infrastructure improvements to the Downtown Ramada Hotel & Convention 27 Center that include: 28 -- Upgrading fire sprinkler systems; 29 -- Modernizing three elevator controls: 30

47 48	Section 2.	Findings. The Governing Body finds the District furthers economic
49	development within the City and further finds it advisable and in the City's best interest	
50	to establish the District and authorize the project as proposed, subject to a Development	
51	Agreement executed by the City Manager.	
52	Section 3.	Estimated Project Cost. The estimated cost of the proposed project
53	within the District is approximately \$4,198,795.00.	
54	Section 4.	Legal Description. The legal description of the District is: Lots 1, 2,
55	3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18, Block Y, and Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6,	
56	7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16, Block U, together with all that portion of vacated	
57	Fifth Street bounded on the North by the South line of Block U, on the East by the West	
58	line of Jefferson Street, extended on the South by the North line of Block Y, and on the	

- 59 West by the East line of Madison Street extended, all in Keyway Subdivision in the City
- 60 of Topeka, Shawnee County, Kansas.
- 61 <u>Section 5.</u> <u>Map</u>. A map of the District is attached as Exhibit A.
- 62 <u>Section 6.</u> <u>Method of Financing; Sales Tax</u>. The method of financing the
   63 Project is through a CID sales tax. The amount of the CID sales tax to be levied shall
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64 be two percent (2%) which tax shall be levied upon all sales of tangible personal 65 property at retail or services taxable within the CID district pursuant to the Kansas 66 Retailers' Sales Tax Act.

67 <u>Section 7</u>. <u>Sales Tax Levy</u>. The City authorizes and hereby levies a two 68 percent (2%) CID sales tax as described in Section 6 which shall expire no later than 22 69 years from the date the state director of taxation begins collecting the tax or when the 70 pay-as-you-go costs have been paid.

<u>Section 8.</u> <u>Effective Date</u>. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on
 from and after its passage by a majority of the Governing Body and publication once in
 the official City newspaper.

## Section 10. <u>Recording.</u> After publication, the City Clerk is hereby directed to file a copy of this ordinance with the Shawnee County Register of Deeds.

Section 11. Kansas Department of Revenue. The City Clerk will provide the
 Kansas Department of Revenue with a certified copy of this ordinance notifying the
 Department of the establishment of the District and the levy of the CID sales tax to
 commence at a date indicated in the development agreement.
