9 10	BE IT ORDAINED B	BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF TOPEKA, KANSAS:		
11	Section1.	That The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended		
12	by adding a section,	to be numbered 9.20.010, which said section reads as follows:		
13	Definitions.			
14	The definition	ns contained in the Kansas Acts Against Discrimination, K.S.A. 44-		
15	1001 to 44-1044; the Kansas Age Discrimination in Employment Act, K.S.A. 44-1111 to			
16	44-1121; and the Discrimination Against Military Personnel Act, K.S.A. 44-1125 to 44-			
17	1128, all as may be amended from time to time, shall apply to this Chapter unless			
18	specifically defined herein.			
19	Section 2.	That section 9.20.020, Policy, of The Code of the City of Topeka,		
20	Kansas, is hereby a	mended to read as follows:		
21	Policy.			
22	The practice	or policy of discrimination against persons by reason of race,		
23	religion, creed, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry or agetheir age, color			
24	disability, familial status, gender identity, genetic information, national origin or ancestry			
25	race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, veteran status or any other factor protected by			
26	law ("protected clas	s") is a matter of concern to the City, since such discrimination not		
27	only threatens the r	ights and privileges of the inhabitants of the City but also menaces		
28	the institutions and	foundations of a free democratic state. It is hereby declared to be		

29 the policy of the City, in exercise of its police power for the protection of the public 30 safety, health and general welfare, for the maintenance of business and good 31 government, and for the promotion of the City's trade and commerce, to eliminate and 32 prevent discrimination or segregation because of race, religion, creed, color, sex, 33 disability, national origin or ancestry orbased on a protected class. It is further declared 34 to be the policy of the City to assure equal opportunity and encouragement for every person, regardless of race, religion, creed, color, sex, disability, national origin or 35 ancestry or agetheir membership in a protected class, to secure and hold, without 36 37 discrimination, employment in any field of work or labor for which the person is 38 otherwise properly qualified; to assure equal opportunity for all persons within this City 39 to full and equal public accommodations and the full and equal use and enjoyment of 40 the services, facilities, privileges and advantages of all governmental departments or 41 agencies; and to assure equal opportunity for all persons within this City in housing, 42 without distinction on account of race, religion, creed, color, sex, disability, national 43 origin or ancestry. 44 That The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended Section 3.

44 <u>Section 3</u>. That The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended
45 by adding a section to be numbered 9.20.030, which said section reads as follows:

Civil Rights Declared.

47 (a) The right of an otherwise qualified person to be free from discrimination
 48 because of that person's actual or perceived age, color, disability, familial status, gender
 49 identity, genetic information, national origin or ancestry, race, religion, sex, sexual
 50 orientation or veteran status is recognized as, and declared to be, a civil right. This right
 51 shall include, but not be limited to, all of the following:

- 52 (1) The right to obtain and hold employment and the benefits
 53 associated therewith without discrimination.
- 54 (2) <u>The right to the full enjoyment of any of the accommodations</u>, 55 <u>advantages, facilities or privileges of any place of public accommodation without</u> 56 <u>discrimination</u>.
- 57 (3) <u>The right to engage in property transactions, including obtaining</u> 58 housing for rental or sale and credit therefor, without discrimination.
- 59(4)The right to exercise any right granted under this ordinance without60suffering coercion or retaliation.
- (b) <u>Because federal and state law consistently address unlawful</u>
 discriminatory and retaliatory practices related to the above-described civil rights, a
 separate enforcement procedure is not created.
- 64 <u>Section 4</u> That section 9.20.040, Intimidation or bias crimes, of The Code of 65 the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 66

Intimidation or bias crimes.

- (a) Any person who violates or attempts to violate any of the following
 ordinances of the code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, and any amendments thereto, by
 reason of any motive or intent relating to, or any antipathy, animosity or hostility based
 upon another individual's or group of individuals' membership in a protected class as
 <u>defined in TMC 9.20.020</u> shall be guilty of a misdemeanor:

84 (b) Any person who, knowingly assembles with one or more persons and 85 agrees with such person or persons to violate any of the criminal laws of the State of 86 Kansas or of the United States with force or violence by reason of any motive or intent 87 relating to, or any antipathy, animosity or hostility based upon, the race, color, sex, religion, national origin, age, sexual orientation, ancestry, or disability of another 88 89 individual or group of individuals, knowingly assembles with two or more persons and 90 agrees with such person or persons to violate any of the criminal laws of the State of 91 Kansas or of the United States with force or violence another individual's or group of 92 individuals' membership in a protected class as defined in TMC 9.20.020 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. 93

94 (c) Penalty.

95 (1) Upon a first conviction of a violation of the provisions of this section a
96 person shall be deemed guilty of a <u>Class B</u> misdemeanor and shall be punished
97 by a fine of not less than \$250.00 nor more than \$2,500in an amount not to

98 <u>exceed \$1,000.00</u>, or by imprisonment for not more than one year <u>a sentence not</u>
 99 <u>to exceed six months</u>, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

(2) On a second or subsequent conviction of a violation of the provisions
of this section a person shall be deemed guilty of a <u>Class A</u> misdemeanor and
shall be sentenced to punished by a fine in an amount not to exceed \$2,500.00,
or by imprisonment of not less than five days, nor more than a sentence not to
exceed one year and a fine of not less than \$500.00 nor more than \$2,500.00, or
by both such fine and imprisonment.

106 <u>Section 5</u>. That The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended
107 by adding a section to be numbered 9.20.050, which said section reads as follows:

108 Severability.

109 If any clause sentence, paragraph or part of this Chapter or the application 110 thereof to any person or circumstances shall for any reason be adjudged by a court of 111 competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate 112 the remainder of this Chapter and the application thereof to other persons or 113 circumstances, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph 114 or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have 115 been rendered and the persons or circumstances involved. It is hereby declared to be 116 the legislative intent that this Chapter would have been adopted had such provisions not 117 been included. 118 That original § 9.20.020 and § 9.20.040 of The Code of the City of Section 6.

- 119 Topeka, Kansas, are hereby specifically repealed.
- 120 <u>Section 7</u>. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its

122 <u>Section 8</u>. This ordinance shall supersede all ordinances, resolutions or rules,
123 or portions thereof, which are in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance.

124 <u>Section 9</u>. Should any section, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared
125 invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the validity of this

126 ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.
