3 4 5	AN ORDINANCE introduced by Acting City Manager Richard U. Nienstedt, concerning the Washburn University Board of Regents, amending § 2.205.050 of the Topeka Municipal Code and
6 7	repealing original section. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF TOPEKA, KANSAS:
8	Section 1. That section 2.205.050, Washburn University of Topeka and the
9	Board of Regents, of The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended to
10	read as follows:
11	Washburn University of Topeka and the Board of Regents.
12	(a) Created. There is hereby established in the City a municipal university as
13	provided by K.S.A. 13-13a03 et seq. and amendments thereto. The university shall be
14	known as Washburn University of Topeka.
15	(b) Management. The management and control of the municipal university shall
16	be vested in a board to be known as the Board of Regents of Washburn University of
17	Topeka. By such name the municipal university may sue and be sued, issue contracts,
18	and hold such real and personal property as it may acquire. Such university shall
19	possess the usual powers of a corporation for public purposes.
20	(c) Membership. The Board of Regents of the municipal university shall consist
21	of nine members appointed as follows:
22	(1) Three members shall be appointed by the Mayor with the approval of
23	the Council and shall hold office as provided in K.S.A. 13-3a0513-13a04 and
24	amendments thereto. Members appointed under this subsection shall be
25	registered voters and residents of the City, one from each of the three member
26	districts from which State senators are elected by residents of the City as

## established in K.S.A. 13-13a04 and amendments thereto.

- (2) Three members shall be appointed by the governor and shall hold office as provided in K.S.A. 13-13a06 and amendments thereto. Members appointed under this subsection shall be residents of the State.
- (3) One member shall be appointed by the Board of County Commissioners of Shawnee County and shall hold office as provided in K.S.A. 13-13a06 and amendments thereto; such member shall reside in Shawnee County, but outside the City.
- (4) One member shall be the Mayor or another member of the Council who is selected by the Mayor.
- (5) One member shall be a member of the State Board of Regents selected by the State Board at its regular meeting in September of each year, to serve as a member of the Board of Regents for the ensuing year.
- (d) Resignations from the Board of Regents shall be made to the chairperson of the Board. The chairperson shall report any vacancy occurring in the Board to the authority which appointed the member whose position is vacant. All vacancies shall be filled, by the authority which appointed the member whose position is vacant, by the appointment of a successor to hold office for the remainder of the unexpired term.
- (e) Immediately after receiving notification of their appointment, Regents-elect shall take oath to uphold the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State, and faithfully, honestly and impartially to discharge the duties of their office. Regents shall serve without compensation.
  - (f) The Board of Regents shall organize each year, electing from their own

number a chairperson and such other officers as may be necessary for the full discharge of the duties imposed on them. A majority of the Regents duly appointed and qualified at any time shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. (g) The Board of Regents shall have the power to adopt a seal and generally to organize itself, prescribe its rules, the duties of its officers, and to do and perform all things, deeds and acts, and have all powers and prerogatives which are now by the provisions conferred upon the Board of Regents pursuant to K.S.A. 13-13a03 et seg. and any amendments thereto. Section 2. That original § 2.205.050 of The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby specifically repealed. Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on July 1, 2023, from and after its passage, approval and publication in the official City newspaper. This ordinance shall supersede all ordinances, resolutions or rules, Section 4. or portions thereof, which are in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance. Section 5. Should any section, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.
