9	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TOPEKA, KANSAS:
11 12	Section 1. That City of Topeka Code § 2-446, Definitions, is hereby amended
13	to read as follows:
14	Definitions.
15	The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the
16	meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a
17	different meaning:
18	Consumable commodity means and includes all tools, equipment, materials,
19	supplies, chemicals, repair parts or other commodities which are acquired in
20	contemplation of providing public service and will be so consumed in the operating,
21	maintaining or administering of public facilities or programs and by reason of their
22	nature do not fit within the definitional framework of a fixed asset.
23	Fixed asset means and includes any property, real or personal, or any other
24	tangible asset, which has an initial cost of \$2,500.00 \$5,000.00 or more and a useful life
25	expectancy of three years or more.
26	Inventory means and includes all consumable commodities which have been
27	acquired and remain on hand for future use.
28	Inventory record means a written record or listing of all inventories. Such record
29	shall include an adequate description of the commodities, the quantities on hand as of a

30	given date, and the unit cost of each unit on hand. The first in-first out, average cost of
31	actual unit cost method as customarily used in determining the cost for inventory
32	purposes shall be used.
33	Section 2. That City of Topeka Code § 2-446 is hereby specifically repealed.
34	Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its
35	passage, approval and publication in the official City newspaper.
