9 10	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TOPEKA, KANSAS:			
11	WHEREAS, the City of Topeka recently adopted the International Building Code			
12	and references to the Uniform Building Code in various sections of the City of Topeka			
13	Code Book need to be updated.			
14	Section 1. That § 26-116, Adoption of Building Codes, of the Code of the City			
15	of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended to read as follows:			
16	Adoption of Building Codes.			
17	Thate City of Topeka adopts the following building codes: International Building			
18	Code, 2006, first printing January 2006, as amended; International Residential Code for			
19	one- and two-family dwellings, 2003 Edition as adopted in part and as amended			
20	Uniform Code for Building Conservation, 1997 edition, as amended; National Electrica			
21	Code, 2005 edition; Uniform Plumbing Code, 2000 edition, as amended; Uniform			
22	Mechanical Code, 1997 edition, as amended; Uniform Fire code, 1997 edition, as			
23	amended, and Life Safety Code, 1991 edition, as amended.			
24	Section 2. That § 26-283, Adoption of rules and regulations, of the Code of the			
25	City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended to read as follows:			
26	Adoption of rules and regulations.			
27	The director of public works or his or her designee shall have the authority to			
28	promulgate such rules and regulations as are necessary to carry out the purposes of the			

29	IRC. Reference may be made to the currently adopted Uniform Building Code for
30	guidance and clarification.
31	Section 3. That § 70-196, Large facilities, of the Code of the City of Topeka,
32	Kansas, is hereby repealed:
33	Large facilities.
34	(a) This section applies to residential board and care occupancies providing
35	sleeping accommodations for 16 or more residents. Large facilities shall meet the
36	requirements of the currently adopted Uniform Building Code. For prompt and moderate
37	evacuation capability, R-1 standards shall apply. For slow and impractical evacuation
38	capability, I-1 standards shall apply.
39	(b) The requirements of this section are applicable to new construction or
40	existing buildings.
41	(c) Emergency lighting for large facilities shall be required in accordance with
42	NFPA standards 70.
43	(d) Smoke alarm systems as per NFPA standards (72A) shall be required in
14	large facilities.
45	(e) The address of large facilities shall be visible from the street on a
46	contrasting background with numbers at least six inches in height.
47	Section 4. That original City of Topeka Code § 26-116 and § 26-283 are
