1 (Published in the Topeka Metro News October 1, 2008) 2 3 4 **ORDINANCE NO. 19165** 5 6 AN ORDINANCE introduced by Councilmember Deborah Swank. creating Chapter 7 66, Article II in the Code of the City of Topeka establishing the Sustainability Advisory Board and amending Section 1 of 8 Ordinance No. 19095 relating to nonstatutory boards and 9 10 commissions and repealing said original section. 11 12 WHEREAS, the City of Topeka desires to promote of natural resource 13 conservation and recycling to ensure economic and environmental quality in Topeka; 14 and 15 WHEREAS, the City of Topeka hereby creates an advisory board to support, 16 strengthen and expand recycling and resource conservation activities and programs. 17 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TOPEKA, KANSAS: 18 19 Section 1. That the Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended 20 by adding a section to be numbered 66-25, which said section reads as follows: 21 Sustainability Advisory Board. 22 There is hereby established the Sustainability Advisory Board, hereinafter 23 referred to as the "Board." The Board shall serve as an advisory board to the Council, 24 and shall involve volunteers and community members. The Board shall prepare and 25 approve minutes of its meetings, and forward the same to the City Council. The Board 26 shall adopt by-laws as deemed appropriate, provided such by-laws are not inconsistent 27 with this article. Section 2. 28 That the Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended 29 by adding a section to be numbered 66-26, which said section reads as follows: 30 Composition; appointments; terms.

31 <u>a.</u> <u>Membership generally.</u> The Sustainability Advisory Board shall consist of
 32 <u>nine (9) members.</u>

33	b. <u>Terms.</u> Of the members of the Board first appointed, four (4) members
34	shall serve one (1) year terms, five (5) members shall serve two (2) year terms. The
35	mayor with the consent of the city council shall determine the terms of each appointed
36	member. Persons appointed to the Board may be reappointed for one (1) additional two
37	(2) year term. No person shall be permitted to serve more than two (2) full consecutive
38	terms as a board member. A period of at least two (2) years shall lapse prior to a
39	former member being eligible for reappointment. After the initial appointment of the
40	Board, all members shall serve two (2) year terms unless appointed to fill out an
41	unexpired term.

- 57 <u>e.</u> <u>Ex officio nonvoting members.</u> In addition to the nine (9) voting board 58 <u>members, there shall be two ex officio nonvoting members which shall be the City</u> 59 Attorney and the Public Works Director or their designees.
- 60 <u>Section 3</u>. That the Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended 61 by adding a section to be numbered 66-27, which said section reads as follows:
- 62 Purpose of the Sustainability Advisory Board.
- 63 The mission of the Board is to promote environmental assessment and advocate
- 64 for policies which support sustainability specifically including but not limited to
- 65 <u>environmental assessment, waste reduction, recycling, energy conservation and natural</u>
- 66 resource conservation in the City of Topeka and to enhance the quality of life by
- 67 improving the City's efforts in these areas.
- 68 <u>Section 4</u>. That the Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended 69 by adding a section to be numbered 66-28, which said section reads as follows:
- 70 Duties of the Sustainability Advisory Board.
- 71 The Board shall advise the City staff and elected officials in the following ways:
- 72 <u>a.</u> <u>Monitor and review present environmental assessment, waste reduction,</u>
 73 <u>recycling, energy conservation, and natural resource conservation efforts</u>
 74 of the City.
- <u>b.</u> Assist the City staff and elected officials to develop and establish goals
 and priorities for future environmental assessment, waste reduction,
 <u>recycling, energy conservation, and natural resource conservation efforts.</u>
- 78 c. Advise the City staff and elected officials on practical methods and

- 79programs to reach their goals for future environmental assessment, waste80reduction, recycling, energy conservation, and natural resource81conservation efforts.
- 82d.Serve as an information resource for the City staff and elected officials.83Receive reports on environmental assessment, waste reduction, recycling,84energy conservation, and natural resource conservation from staff of all85affected City departments.
- 86 <u>e.</u> <u>Maintain regular communication with the City staff and elected officials</u>
 87 <u>regarding Board activities and recommendations.</u>

88 <u>Section 5.</u> That Section 1 of City of Topeka Ordinance No. 19095, is hereby
89 amended to read as follows:

90 Establishment.

91 The following nonstatutory boards, commissions and other plural authorities are 92 hereby established and made a part of the administrative code of the city, as authorized 93 by Charter Ordinance No. 94, § 24 [App. A, § A2-72]: Cereal Malt Beverage License 94 Review Board (TCC 10-91); Human Relations Commission (TCC 86-27); Mobile Home Craftsmen Board of Examiners (TCC 98-211); Board of Electrical Appeals (TCC 26-236 95 96 et seq.); Board of Plumbing Examiners (TCC 26-236 et seq.); Board of Mechanical 97 Examiners (TCC 26-236 et seq.); Board of Building and Fire Appeals (TCC 26-138); 98 Board of Zoning Appeals (TCC 48-34.00 et seq.); Golf Course Advisory Board (TCC 99 102-196 et seq.); Parks and Recreation Advisory Board (TCC 102-51 et seq.); 100 Redistricting Commission (TCC 2-198); Citizen Advisory Council (TCC 42-4); Civil 101 Service Commission (TCC 106-41); Topeka Planning Commission (TCC 110-27); 102 Boards of Trustees of Fire and Police Pension Funds (TCC 106-204); Administrative

Review Board for Tax Exemptions (TCC 138-79); City of Topeka Americans with 103 104 Disabilities Act Advisory Council (TCC 86-200); Sustainability Advisory Board (TCC 66-105 25). The council is hereby authorized to promulgate appropriate rules and regulations 106 for such boards, commissions and authorities dealing with their organization and 107 operation. No city employee shall be appointed to any board, commission, or plural 108 authority unless the appointment is specifically authorized by ordinance. Unless 109 otherwise provided, all members appointed to any board, commission, or plural 110 authority shall be residents of the city. The mayor shall notify council members 30 days 111 in advance of vacancies occurring on such bodies, shall solicit nominations from the 112 council for filling such positions, and shall appoint members to such bodies from those 113 nominated by the council. In the event no nominations are forthcoming, the mayor shall 114 make such appointments as is in the best interest of or will best serve the mission of the 115 board, commission, or authority. All appointments must be confirmed by the council. 116 Unless otherwise provided for in this code, members will be appointed for a term of two 117 years and shall not serve beyond the end of their appointed terms. Upon expiration of a 118 term the position shall remain vacant until a successor is appointed.

- <u>Section 6</u>. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its
 passage, approval and publication in the official City newspaper.
