	Section 1. Th	at section 50-48, Definitions, of The Code of the City of Topeka,
14	Kansas, is hereby amended to read as follows:	
15	Definitions.	
16	As used in this A	Act:
17	(1) Appearai	nce bond means an undertaking, with or without security, entered
18	into by a person in custody by which the person is bound to comply with the conditions	
19	of the undertaking.	
20	(2) Accused	person means a person, corporation or other legal entity accused
21	by a complaint of the violation of a city ordinance.	
22	(3) Arraignm	ent means the formal act of calling the person accused of
23	violating an ordinance before the municipal court to inform the person of the offense	
24	with which the person is charged, to ask the person whether the person is guilty or not	
25	guilty and, if guilty, to impose sentence.	
26	(4) Arrest me	eans the taking of a person into custody in order that the person
27	will appear to answer for the violation of an ordinance. The giving of a notice to appear	
28	is not an arrest.	

- (5) Bail is the security given for the purpose of insuring compliance with the terms of an appearance bond.
 - (6) City attorney means any attorney who represents the city in the prosecution of an accused person for the violation of a city ordinance.
 - (7) Complaint means a sworn written statement, or a written statement by a law enforcement officer, the city attorney or an assistant city attorney, an animal control officer, parking control officer as specifically authorized by Topeka City Code section 142-429, property maintenance inspector as specifically authorized by Topeka City Code section 142-355 or a fire department employee with authority to enforce the Uniform Fire Code of the essential facts constituting a violation of an ordinance.
 - (8) Custody means the restraint of a person pursuant to an arrest.
 - (9) Detention means the temporary restraint of a person by a law enforcement officer.
 - (10) Law enforcement officer means any person who by virtue of office or public employment is vested by law with a duty to maintain public order and to make arrests for violation of the laws of the State of Kansas or ordinances of any municipality thereof. For the purposes of signing and serving a uniform complaint and notice to appear or a subpoena, the term shall also mean the city attorney or an assistant city attorney, an animal control officer, parking control officer as specifically authorized by Topeka City Code section 142-429, property maintenance inspector as specifically authorized by Topeka City Code section 142-355 or a fire department employee with authority to enforce the Uniform-Fire Code.

- (11) Notice to appear is a written notice to a person accused by a complaint of having violated an ordinance of a city to appear at a stated time and place to answer to the charge of the complaint.
- (12) Subpoena is a process issued by the court to cause a witness to appear and give testimony at a time and place therein specified.
- (13) Ordinance traffic infraction is a violation of an ordinance that proscribes or requires the same behavior as that proscribed or required by a statutory provision that is classified as a traffic infraction in K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 8-2118 and amendments thereto.
- (14) Warrant is a written order made by a municipal judge directed to any law enforcement officer commanding the officer to arrest the person named or described in it.
- (15) Ordinance cigarette or tobacco infraction is a violation of an ordinance that proscribes the same behavior as proscribed by subsection (13m) or (14n) of K.S.A. 79-3321 and amendments thereto.
- <u>Section 2</u>. That section 70-56, Adoption of rules and regulations, of The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Adoption of rules and regulations.

The chief of the fire department shall have the authority to promulgate such rules and regulations as are necessary to carry out the purposes of the Uniform Fire Code and Life Safety Code, and such rules and regulations shall be effective upon their approval by the mayor city manager.

Section 3. That section 70-71, Complaint, of The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is herby amended to read as follows:

Complaint.

Whenever any person operating or maintaining any occupancy, premises or vehicle subject to the Uniform Fire Code or such other ordinances enforced by the fire chief fails to take immediate action when ordered or notified to do so by the fire chief or a duly authorized representative to abate a fire hazard existing on premises under the person's control, the fire chief or a duly authorized representative shall issue a complaint charging the accused person of violating the Uniform Fire Code or such other ordinance enforced by the fire chief.

<u>Section 4</u>. That section 70-86, Uniform Fire Code and standards adopted, of The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

UniformAdoption of 2006 International Fire Code and standards adopted.

- (a) There is hereby adopted by reference the Uniform Fire Code, 1997 edition, of the International Conference of Building Officials, and the Western Fire Chiefs Association, 300 N. Main Avenue, Suite 25, Fallbrook, California 92028, published by International Fire Code Institute, 5360 South Workman Mill Road, Whittier, California, 90601-2298, (562) 699-0124. The code shall include all codified supplements to the Uniform Fire Code, 1997 edition, and the following Uniform Fire Code articles 1, 2, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 51, 52, 61, 62, 63, 64, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, 80, 81, 82, 84, 85, 87, 88, and 90. The code is made a part of this Code and incorporated herein as if fully set out in this division, except as hereafter provided.
- (b) The U.F.C. Standards, Volume 2, which are referred to in various parts of the fire code shall be the Uniform Fire Code Standards, 1997 edition, and all codified

supplements thereto, and said U.F.C. Standards are hereby declared to be a part of the				
fire prevention code of the city.
