Licensed retailers may sell non-alcoholic commodities or food between the 17 hours of 5:00 p.m. and 11:30 p.m. on June 20, 2009. 18 b) The barricaded portion of SW Eighth Avenue between Kansas Avenue and 19 Jackson Street, shall be temporarily removed from the City's right-of-way and the 20 provisions of K.S.A. 41-719. Vendors holding the appropriate license from the State of 21 Kansas to sell alcoholic liquor may in accordance with all applicable state laws and 22 municipal ordinances sell alcoholic liquor in the specific area designated by the division of 23 Alcohol Beverage Control within the barricaded portion of SW Eighth Avenue between the 24 hours of 5:00 p.m. and 11:30 p.m. on June 20, 2009. 25 c) Event attendees may buy, possess and consume alcoholic beverages in the 26 specific area designated by the division of Alcohol Beverage Control within the barricaded 27 portion of Eighth Avenue between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and 11:30 p.m. on June 20, 2009. 28
