4 **ORDINANCE NO. 19305**

6 AN ORDINANCE introduced by Councilmember Karen Hiller authorizing the sale,
7 consumption and possession of alcoholic liquor as part of the Hispanic
8 Heritage Month Mexican Independence Day Celebration at specified
9 locations and times.

11 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
12 TOPEKA, KANSAS:

13 Section 1. a) Authorization is given to barricade a portion of the Quincy Street
14 from 7th Street to 8th Street on September 19, 2009 between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and
15 11:00 p.m. Attendance to the celebration is open to the public between these hours.
16 Licensed retailers may sell non-alcoholic commodities or food between the hours of 5:00
17 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. on September 19, 2009.

18 b) The barricaded portion of Quincy Street shall be temporarily removed from
19 the City's right-of-way and the provisions of K.S.A. 41-719. Vendors holding the
20 appropriate license from the State of Kansas to sell alcoholic beverages and liquor may in
21 accordance with all applicable state laws and municipal ordinances sell alcoholic beverages
22 and liquor in the specific area designated by the division of Alcohol Beverage Control within
23 the barricaded portion of Quincy Street between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. on
24 September 19, 2009.

25 c) Event attendees may buy, possess and consume alcoholic beverages in the
26 specific area designated by the division of Alcohol Beverage Control within the barricaded
27 portion of Quincy Street between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. on September 19,
28 2009.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be null and void on September 20, 2009.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force after its passage,

approval and publication in the official city newspaper.
