	<u>Secti</u>	on 1. That section 9.45.160, Standards, of The Code of the City of			
14	Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended to read as follows:				
15	Stan	Standards.			
16	The	The standards which shall be considered in determining whether a violation of			
17	this article exists shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following:				
18	(a)	The volume of the noise;			
19	(b)	The intensity of the noise;			
20	(c)	Whether the nature of the noise is usual or unusual;			
21	(d)	Whether the origin of the noise is natural or unnatural;			
22	(e)	The volume and intensity of the background noise, if any;			
23	(f)	The proximity of the noise to residential sleeping facilities residences;			
24	(g)	The nature and zoning of the area within which the noise emanates;			
25	(h)	The density of the inhabitation of the area within which the noise			
26	emanates;				
27	(i)	The time of the day or night the noise occurs;			
28	(j)	(j) The duration of the noise;			
29	(k)	Whether the noise is recurrent, intermittent or constant; and			

30 (I) Whether the noise is produced by a commercial or noncommercial activity.
 31 <u>Section 2</u>. That section 9.45.170, Prohibition generally, of The Code of the
 32 City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

33

Prohibition generally.

34 It shall be unlawful for any person to make, continue or causeallow to be (a) 35 made or continued, any loudexcessive, unnecessary, or-unusual or loud noise or any 36 noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, 37 peace or safety of others within the limits of the city of any person of reasonable 38 sensibilities, or which interferes with the use or enjoyment of property of any person of 39 reasonable sensibilities unless the making and continuing of such noise is necessary for the protection and preservation of property or the health and safety of an individual; 40 41 provided, that the provisions of this article shall not apply to such occasional and 42 infrequent uses as authorized by resolution approved by the city council, upon a 43 showing by an applicant and determination by the council that the proposed use does 44 not offend the spirit of the findings of TMC 9.45.150.

- 45 (b) The acts mentioned in the following sections of this article, among others,
 46 are declared to be loud, disturbing and unnecessary noises in violation of this article,
 47 but such enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive.
- 48 <u>Section 3</u>. That section 9.45.190, Radios, phonographs, etc., of The Code of 49 the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 50

Radios, phonographs, etcSound-producing device.

51 (a) The using, operating or permitting to be played, used or operated any 52 radio receiving set, musical instrument, phonograph or other machine or<u>use or</u>

53 <u>operation of any</u> device for the capable of producing or reproducing of amplifying sound 54 in such manner as to disturb the peace, quiet and comfort of the neighboring inhabitants 55 or at any time with louder volume than is necessary for convenient hearing for the 56 persons who are in the room, vehicle or chamber in which the machine or device is 57 operated and who are voluntary listeners thereto any person of reasonable sensibilities 58 is unlawful.

(b) The <u>use or operation of any radio receiving set, musical instrument,</u>
phonograph, machine or device <u>identified in subsection (a)</u> between the hours of 11:00
p.m. and 7:00 a.m. in such a manner as to be plainlywhich is audible at a distance of 50
feet from the <u>premises</u>, building, structure or vehicle in which it<u>the device</u> is located
shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this section.

- 64 <u>Section 4</u>. That section 9.45.290, Construction or repairing of buildings, of The 65 Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 66 Construction or repairing of buildings and exterior construction projects.

The erection (including excavating), demolition, <u>exterior</u> alteration or <u>exterior</u> repair of any building <u>or exterior construction project</u> is <u>permittedprohibited</u> between the hours of 7:00 <u>a.m.p.m.</u> and 7:00 <u>p.m.a.m</u> Monday through Saturday. Exceptions may be granted in the interest of public health and safety with authorization from the code enforcement director<u>city manager or designee</u>. Written permission for such work may be granted by the code enforcement officer after receipt of written justification.

- 73 <u>Section 5</u>. That section 9.45.210, Steam whistles, of The Code of the City of
 74 Topeka, Kansas, is hereby repealed.

Steam whistles.

76	The blowing of any locomotive steam whistle or steam whistle attached to any		
77	stationary boiler or other signal device except to give notice of the time to begin or stop		
78	work or as a warning of fire, danger or upon request or authorization of proper city		
79	authorities is unlawful.		
80	Section 6. That section 9.45.230, Defect in vehicle or load, of The Code of the		
81	City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby repealed.		
82	Defect in vehicle or load.		
83	The use of any automobile, motorcycle or vehicle so out of repair, so loaded or in		
84	such manner as to create loud and unnecessary grating, grinding, rattling or other		
85	noises is unlawful.		
86	Section 7. That section 9.45.240, Metal rails, pillars and columns –		
87	Transportation thereof, of The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby repealed.		
88	Metal rails, pillars and columns – Transportation thereof.		
89	The transportation of rails, pillars or columns of iron, steel or other material over		
90	and along streets and other public places upon carts, drays, cars, trucks or in any other		
91	manner when so loaded as to cause loud noises or as to disturb the peace and quiet of		
92	such streets or other public places is unlawful.		
93	Section 8. That section 9.45.250, Loading or unloading vehicle – Opening or		
94	destruction of boxes, of The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby repealed.		
95	Loading or unloading vehicle – Opening or destruction of boxes.		
96	The creation of loud and excessive noise in connection with loading or unloading		
97	any vehicle or the opening and destruction of bales, boxes, crates and containers is		
98	unlawful.		

- 99 <u>Section 9</u>. That section 9.45.270, Hawkers, peddlers, of The Code of the City
 100 of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby repealed.
- 101 Hawkers, peddlers.
- 102 The shouting and crying of peddlers, hawkers and vendors which disturbs the 103 peace and quiet of the neighborhood is unlawful.
- 104 <u>Section 10</u>. That section 9.45.320, In proximity to schools, courts, churches,
 105 hospitals, of The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby repealed.
- 106 In proximity to schools, courts, churches, hospitals.
- 107 The creation of any excessive noise on any street adjacent to any school, 108 institution of learning, church or court while the same is in use, or which disturbs the 109 workings of such institution, or which disturbs or unduly annoys patients in a hospital, 110 provided conspicuous signs are displayed in such streets indicating that the street is a
- 111 school, hospital or court street, is unlawful.
- 112 Section 11. That original § 9.45.160, § 9.45.170, § 9.45.190 and § 9.45.290 of
 113 The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, are hereby specifically repealed.
- 114 <u>Section 12</u>. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its
 115 passage, approval and publication in the official City newspaper.
- 116 <u>Section 13</u>. This ordinance shall supersede all ordinances, resolutions or rules,
 117 or portions thereof, which are in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance.
- <u>Section 14</u>. Should any section, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared
 invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the validity of this
 ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.
