1 (Published in the Topeka Metro News February 18, 2013) 2 3 **ORDINANCE NO. 19794** 4 5 AN ORDINANCE introduced by Jim Colson, City Manager, authorizing Improvement 6 Project No. T-281039.01 for the rehabilitation of flood protection relief 7 wells approving cost estimates of the proposed improvements, and doing all other things necessary and incidental thereto, and 8 9 authorizing the use of utility operation funds, authorizing the publication of the Notice of Intention of the governing body of the City 10 of Topeka, Kansas, to issue and sell revenue bonds of said City to 11 12 make such improvements which constitutes improvements to the 13 municipally owned water, water pollution control, and stormwater utility 14 system of the City of Topeka, Shawnee County, Kansas, pursuant to 15 K.S.A. 10-101 and 10-1201, et seq., and all amendments thereto, 16 authorizing issuance of general obligation bonds to pay the costs of 17 the project which further constitutes a general improvement to the Citv's sanitary and/or stormwater and sewage disposal system 18 pursuant to City of Topeka Code § A12-1. 19 20 21 WHEREAS, the City is a municipality as defined by K.S.A. 10-101 and 10-1201 et 22 seq. and all amendments thereto; and 23 WHEREAS, the City is authorized by the laws of the State of Kansas to issue and 24 sell revenue bonds of the City for the improvement of its water, water pollution control, and 25 stormwater utility system (the "System") pursuant to K.S.A. 10-1201 et seq. and all 26 amendments thereto; and 27 WHEREAS, it is deemed by the Governing Body of the City to be necessary and 28 advisable that the City to improve its System by rehabilitation of flood protection relief wells. 29 This project will include, but is not limited to, rehabilitation or replacement of eleven (11) 30 existing flood protection relief wells with new pumping units, new pump motor starters, 31 installation of new or replacement piezometers, new water level sensors and any related 32 appurtenances needed for a complete project and doing all things necessary and incidental 33 thereto (the "Project") and that the preliminary plans, specifications and cost estimates for the Project heretofore duly prepared and filed in the office of the City Clerk of said City,
which estimates show a total cost of the improvements to be approximately one million two
hundred thirty-nine thousand three hundred seven dollars (\$1,239,307.00) be approved;
and

WHEREAS, it is found by the Governing Body that such Project will not cause a
duplication of existing utility service furnished by a private utility; and

40 WHEREAS, the City of Topeka, Shawnee County, Kansas, is authorized pursuant to 41 City of Topeka Code § A12-1, to issue general obligation bonds for the purposes of paying 42 for improvement, repair or extension to the City's waterworks system and sanitary and 43 stormwater sewage disposal system; and

44 WHEREAS, the City desires to issue and sell revenue bonds and/or general 45 obligation bonds of the City to fund the cost of the improvements or any combination 46 thereof.

47 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF48 TOPEKA, KANSAS:

49 <u>Section 1</u>. That the estimates of costs of the Project as contained in the project
50 budget, in the total amount of one million two hundred thirty-nine thousand three hundred
51 seven dollars (\$1,239,307.00) which are set out on the project budget attached hereto and
52 on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City, be and the same are hereby approved.

53 <u>Section 2</u>. That the general nature of the Project is as follows:

54 The project consists of rehabilitation of eleven (11) existing Flood Protection Relief 55 Wells, to protect the critical plant piping and in-ground structures in the event of a major 56 flood on the Kansas River located immediately adjacent to the water plant complex. A 57 contractor was selected to evaluate, develop concepts/methods for and implement the
58 following flood relief well rehabilitation strategies in accordance with US-ACE directives and
59 requirements:

60	• Rehabilitation of eleven (11) existing flood protection relief wells or		
61	replacement by constructing new wells;		
62	• Size, furnish and install complete new pumping units in each well;		
63	• Size, furnish and install complete new pump motor starters in 4-X stainless		
64	steel panels;		
65	Motor starters shall have additional contactors for SCADA System		
66	integration, alarms and water level sensors for individual pump operational		
67	control;		
68	Install new or replacement piezometers in close proximity to relief wells and		
69	as required;		
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70	 Water level sensors will be mutually selected with Owner approval;

80 Section 3. That notice be given by the governing body of the City of its intention to 81 complete the Project in accordance with the plans, specifications and cost estimates and 82 use utility operation funds, and/or to sell revenue bonds and/or general obligation bonds of 83 the City in a total amount not exceeding one million two hundred thirty-nine thousand three 84 hundred seven dollars (\$1,239,307.00) to pay the cost thereof. Such notice shall be signed 85 by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk and shall be published in the official City 86 newspaper. Such notice shall describe the nature of the proposed improvements and shall 87 state the amount of revenue and/or general obligation bonds proposed to be issued or any 88 combination thereof for the payment of the cost of the project and otherwise, the notice 89 shall be in the form as provided by law.

90 That unless written protests against such proposed improvements Section 4. 91 signed by not less than twenty percent (20%) of the qualified electors of the City are filed 92 with the City Clerk within fifteen (15) days after publication of the notice herein authorized 93 the City both reasonably expects and intends to finance the costs as hereinbefore 94 described from the proceeds of revenue bonds and/or general obligation bonds or any 95 combination thereof, payable from the rates, fees and charges of the System. The City 96 does hereby express its official intent to reimburse any expenditures made in connection 97 with the Project from System enterprise fund, or obligations incurred by, on or after the date 98 which is sixty (60) days before the effective date of this Ordinance from the proceeds of its 99 revenue bonds as aforesaid in the maximum principal amount previously described in 100 accordance with U.S. Treasury Regulation 1.150-2. This Ordinance, as the expression of 101 the governing body's official intent regarding the matters described herein, will be available,

102 for public inspection in the City Clerk's office at City Hall during regular business hours of103 the City.
