4 5 6 7	AN ORDINANCE introduced by Councilmember Elaine Schwartz, concerning firework regulations with respect to special events, amending City of Topeka Code § 8.35.070 and repealing original section.
8 9	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF TOPEKA,
10	KANSAS:
11	Section 1. That section 8.35.070, of The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas,
12	is hereby amended to read as follows:
13	Fireworks.
14	(a) Definitions.
15	(1) "Fireworks" shall mean any composition or device for the purpose
16	of producing a visible or an audible effect for entertainment purposes by
17	combustion, deflagration, or detonation, that meets the definition of "consumer
18	fireworks" or "display fireworks" as set forth in this code. [NFPA 1124, 2006]
19	(2) "Consumer fireworks" shall mean any small firework devices
20	containing restricted amounts of pyrotechnic composition, designed primarily to
21	produce visible or audible effects by combustion that comply with the
22	construction, chemical composition, and labeling regulations of the U.S.
23	Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), as set forth in CPSC 16 CFR
24	1500 and 1507, 49 CFR 172, and APA Standard 87-1, Standard for the
25	Construction and Approval for Transportation of Fireworks, Novelties and
26	Theatrical Pyrotechnics [NFPA 1124, 2006]. Metal sparklers are specifically
27	excluded from the definition of consumer fireworks.
28	(3) "Display fireworks" shall mean large fireworks devices that are

(3) "Display fireworks" shall mean large fireworks devices that are
 explosive material intended for use in fireworks displays and designed to produce
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visible or audible effects by combustion, deflagration, or detonation, as set forth
in CPSC 16 CFR 1500 and 1507, 49 CFR 172, and APA Standard 87-1,
Standard for the Construction and Approval for Transportation of Fireworks,
Novelties, and Theatrical Pyrotechnics.

34 (4) "Fire chief" shall mean the duly appointed chief of the city of
 35 Topeka fire department or any person designated by said chief to enforce the
 36 provisions of this chapter.

37 (5) "Special event" shall mean an organized celebration,
 38 commemoration, occasion or other similar event sponsored by a non-profit
 39 religious, educational or community service organization.

40 (b) Metal Sparklers. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess, transport,
41 or ignite a metal sparkler within the city.

42 (c) Possession/Discharge of Fireworks. It shall be unlawful for any person to
43 possess, transport, ignite, discharge or cause to be discharged any firework in the city
44 except as specifically permitted in this section.

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Consumer fireworks may be discharged within the city of Topeka as

- 47 (i) Between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. on July 1st, July 2nd48 and July 3rd of each year.
- 49 (ii) Between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 11:59 p.m. on July 4th of each
 50 year.
- 51 (2) A person shall not recklessly or intentionally discharge, ignite or 52 otherwise cause a firework:
- 53 (i) To place another person in reasonable apprehension of immediate 54 bodily harm;

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(1)

follows:

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(ii) To cause physical contact with another person; or

56 (iii) To deface or damage real or personal property of another person 57 without the consent of any such other person.

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(3) A person shall not ignite or discharge fireworks into, under, or from 59 a car or vehicle, whether moving or standing still, or on a public roadway or the 60 right-of-way adjoining a public roadway.

61 (4) Fireworks shall not be discharged within 100 feet of any "place or 62 institution," as defined by National Fire Protection Association Standard No. 101, 63 which is adopted by reference in K.A.R. 22-1-3, or any retail fireworks stand or 64 facility where fireworks are stored. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2007 65 Supp. 31-133; effective January 1, 1973; amended May 1, 1986; amended 66 December 29, 2008.)

67 Further, it shall be unlawful for any person to possess, ignite or (5) otherwise cause the discharge of any firework that is not a consumer firework or 68 any firework which is prohibited by federal or state statute or regulation. 69

70 (d) Sale of Fireworks.

71 (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell, hold for sale, or offer for 72 sale at retail, any consumer fireworks in the city unless such person has first 73 obtained a permit from the city as a retailer.

74 (2) Any person desiring to sell or offer for sale any consumer fireworks 75 as a retailer shall make application to the city clerk for a permit authorizing the 76 same. Such application shall include the following information and such 77 additional information as the fire chief shall deem necessary:

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(i) The name and residence address of the applicant.

(ii) The location of the premises for which the permit is sought. If
ownership of premises is different from the applicant, written consent of the
owner is required.

82 (iii) When the permit is sought in a temporary structure or facility, the 83 applicant shall provide a legal description of the premises, a description of the 84 structure or facility to be used, and the location of such structure or facility upon 85 the premises. All temporary structures, including tents, shall be posted with the 86 approved NFPA 704 placards. A copy of subsection (c) of this section shall also 87 be posted on all premises where fireworks are sold. Such notice shall be at least 88 eight and one-half inches by 11 inches in size and printed in type no smaller than 89 12 characters per inch. After an inspection of the premises including review by 90 appropriate city agencies such as the fire department and developmental 91 services director, and consideration of the information contained in the 92 application for a permit, the fire chief may issue a permit therefor, conditioned 93 upon reasonable safety measures to be specified in the permit and upon 94 payment by the applicant of a fee of \$280.00 to the city clerk. Any permit issued 95 under the provisions of this section shall be valid only for the period of June 27th 96 through and including July 5th of the year in which issued and shall be issued in 97 accordance with the International Fire Code article entitled "Permits." Persons 98 responsible for the operations of firework stands in which fireworks are stored or 99 handled shall be familiar with safety requirements for the materials being sold. 100 and the appropriate actions necessary in the event of a fire. Additionally, each 101 seller is required to give each purchaser of fireworks at the time of sale a written 102 notice stating the following:

103The discharge of fireworks is lawful in the City of Topeka on July 1,104July 2 and July 3 from the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., and on105July 4 from 8:00 a.m. to 11:59 p.m. Discharge on any other day or106during any other times is unlawful.

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- 108 (e) Confiscation of Fireworks. Any fireworks in the immediate possession or 109 control of a person violating any city ordinance controlling the use of fireworks may be 110 confiscated by any sworn law enforcement official, the fire chief, or any member of the 111 fire department who has been duly authorized by the fire chief. Confiscated fireworks 112 must be retained by the confiscating agency and may only be destroyed upon approval 113 by the court. The city council encourages the fire department to continue public 114 education efforts and encourages the police department to work internally and with the 115 community to develop improved strategies for enforcement.
- (f) Adult Supervision Required. At all times that it is lawful for any person over the age of 18 years to possess and discharge permitted consumer fireworks, it shall also be lawful for a person under the age of 18 years to possess and discharge permitted consumer fireworks when such person does so under adult supervision and in the physical presence of the adult. It shall be unlawful for any person over the age of 18 years to permit a person under the age of 18 to discharge fireworks without adult supervision and in the physical presence of the adult.
- (g) Rules and Regulations. Display fireworks may be sold and ignited and/or
 discharged pursuant to rules and regulations established by the chief of the Topeka fire
 department.
- (h) Special events. Consumer fireworks may be ignited and/or discharged for
 a special event pursuant to rules and regulations established by the fire chief or
 designee.

(hi) Penalties. Any person convicted of violating any of the provisions in this
section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not
less than \$250.00 to a maximum amount of \$499.00 per violation. In addition to any
fine, the individual may be sentenced up to 179 days in jail. The fine shall not be
paroled.

134 <u>Section 2</u>. That original § 8.35.070 of The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, 135 is hereby specifically repealed.

<u>Section 3</u>. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its
 passage, approval and publication in the official City newspaper.

- 138 <u>Section 4</u>. This ordinance shall supersede all ordinances, resolutions or rules,
 139 or portions thereof, which are in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance.
- 140 <u>Section 5</u>. Should any section, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared
 141 invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the validity of this
 142 ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.
